The BAC Scholarship program is designed for **2010 GRADUATING SENIORS** who are past or present participants in BAC sports programs. In the year 2010 the BAC will award four \$1,000.00 scholarships to BHS students and one \$1,000 to a non-BHS student.* The criteria for consideration of these scholarships is based solely on the completion of this application and the accompanying essay. Academic standing and performance are not considered for these scholarships.

*A separate scholarship selection process for non-BHS applicants will be subject to a minimum of 5 essays being submitted by non-BHS students. If less than 5 non-BHS students apply for the scholarship, the non-BHS students will be placed in the pool with the BHS student applicants and will be eligible for selection of one of the scholarships offered if they are selected as one of the top 5 essays. If a non-BHS student is not selected to receive a BAC Scholarship, a 5th scholarship will be awarded to a BHS student.
